As directed by the Executive Committee on August 23, 2013

Technology developed as part of the Intercloud Project will be distributed under an Open Source License. All members are advised that technology which they contribute to the Intercloud Project will be distributed as such and by their contribution give all rights, title, and license to enable that distribution.
